
MIND THE CCRzzz

We are enjoying the extended spring and the additional rain. The robins and swallows, and those pesky magpies, are filling the air with song and raucous. In addition to the welcome blooming of spring flowers, and the scent of barbeques, we are beginning to see boats, campers, trailers, skateboard tracks, etc., abusing the limits designated in the CC&Rs for length of time that these items are parked and visible in driveways.

To quote:

- 11. All properties are to be maintained by the owner/tenants to maintain the aesthetic quality of the neighborhood. No unsightliness will be permitted which will detract from the overall atmosphere and value of existing and future homes. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing:
- a) Any unsightly structures, equipment, tools, boats, ski-doos, snowmobiles, construction/business trailers, or storage vehicles, vehicles other than automobile objects and conditions shall be stored within an approved building or appropriately screened from view, except equipment being used during construction & maintenance or repairs.
- b) No trailers, mobile homes, truck campers or trucks other than pickup trucks shall be kept or permitted to be stored upon the property except in accordance with CC&R Article X Sec. 9.
- c) No vehicle, boat or equipment shall be cons reconstructed or abandoned upon the property

In 1992 an amendment was introduced at a General Membership meeting that would have permitted recreational vehicles to be stored on the residence. The HOA General Membership did NOT approve that amendment. So please be courteous to your neighbors by maintaining our Good Neighbor policy. Clean and restock within the 48-hour limit, then remove.

REPORT ON S.S. MAILBOX SURVEY

More than fifty % of HOA members responded to this survey. We received many good and constructive suggestions that we appreciate immensely. Sixty-three percent of respondents did want a new style box. More than 2/3 of respondents did not want to use the same boxes that NorthShore is using. Nearly half wantall the boxes to conform to one style while the other half feel that since our homes are all different our mailboxes should reflect the architecture of the corresponding house. The recommendation was made that the Board establish a prototype mailbox that is both modern, easy to maintain, functional, and priced moderately. Then the policy would be that members can either select the conforming prototype or use a style they prefer as long as it is approved by the ARC committee and is within the spirit of our neighborhood architecture. All newly installed boxes must be anchored in cement. Hardman mailboxes and ARC approved boxes in good condition will be grandfathered. The most common remark and priority is that mailboxes must be kept in tip-top condition at all times.

The Board will accept prototype suggestions and pictures from our members until June 30th. The next newsletter will announce the new Silver Springs mailbox. Send suggestions to address at top of newsletter.
